



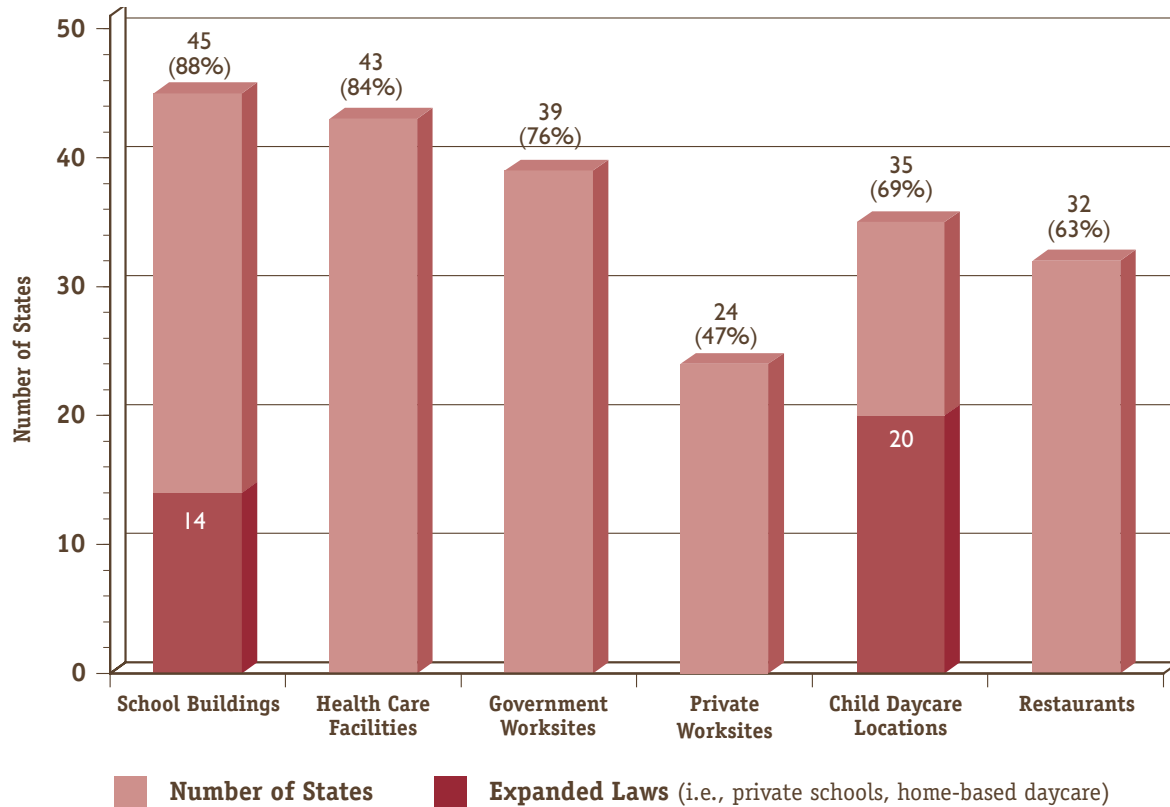

CLEAN INDOOR AIR

Number of States With Clean Indoor Air Laws for Specified Locations (through December 31, 2001)



Locations

(State regulations, and/or executive orders, and industry-based rules are not reflected.)

While three states—**Alabama, North Carolina, and Wyoming**—have not enacted any clean indoor air provisions in state law for selected locations, the remaining states and the **District of Columbia** have approved a range of smoking-related measures for these locations. A review of six locations—school buildings, health care facilities, child daycare locations, restaurants, and public and private worksites—identified state-enacted legislation as minimal as sign-posting requirements for no smoking/smoking areas to legislation prohibiting smoking in one or more location(s). Forty-five states (88%) have approved some form of clean indoor air law affecting public schools. Of those states, 14 explicitly specify the application of smoking restrictions to private schools. Forty-three states (84%) have laws that regulate smoking in health care facilities. State laws on the smoking

environment in government worksites have been enacted in 39 states (76%). In addition, 24 states (47%) have enacted clean indoor air measures for private worksites. State clean indoor air laws are also common in the area of daycare; 35 states (69%) address daycare locations. Twenty of these specifically address requirements for home-based daycare. Thirty-two states (63%) have laws pertaining to clean indoor air in restaurants. States were given credit for legislation for each of the six locations, irrespective of the level of restrictiveness of the law. Note also that state regulations or executive orders and private, industry-based rules or policies that were not adopted to comply with a state statutory mandate are not considered here, but may also be a factor in a state's overall clean indoor air policies.
